Donor # 4101 Interview Notes

Donor 4101 has vibrant red hair, a groomed goatee, a round face, full lips and an adorable nose. When I met with him he was wearing a tucked in solid t-shirt and a pair of slacks with sporty leather shoes. He is tall and fit and maintains a boyish quality. He is a handsome man with a beauty that is reminiscent of classical antiquity. Upon our first meeting I immediately pictured him cast as a centaur or faun in mythical performance. The donor has attractive creamy skin. Donor 4101 lists his freckles as one of his defining features; however after meeting him and seeing the combination of his fair skin and bright red hair, I would say these features are more of a highlight. The donor noted that he is often referred to as a red-headed Matt Damon.

His voice is deep and soothing and his face is relaxed, yet expressive. Donor 4101 strikes me as someone who is not easily excitable. He seems to have the potential to stay calm and collected in stressful situations. Noting this, it came as no surprise to learn that he had been a police officer. He said what he enjoyed most about being a police officer was the being able to help people in need and, somewhat in jest, said, “to keep the bad guys off the street”. Donor 4101 is currently completing his bachelor degree and hopes to continue into a job in law enforcement in the future. He also takes pride in his current job, using it as an opportunity to fine-tune his management style and customer service. When he is not working he enjoys playing music such as bass, guitar, drums and piano.

The donor has very matter-of-fact mannerisms. His health history form was completed with an obvious thoughtfulness and thoroughness that was very reassuring for the staff. The length of the donor’s health history may seem intimidating at first. However, after critically reviewing the variety of conditions one will notice that many of the conditions can be considered benign or minor.

Donor originally chose to be an anonymous donor. However, after careful consideration, Donor 4101 has decided to participate in our Identity-Release® Program.
