Genital/Reproductive: **PGM: Breast Cancer, onset at 61 and again at 72, treated solely with lump removal, went into remission both times.**
Heart: **F: High Cholesterol, onset at 40, treated with medication and diet changes, now stable. PGM: Heart Failure, died of heart failure at 87. PGF: High Blood Pressure, diagnosed in his 40's, treated with diet. PU: Heart Attack, cause of death at age 56; High Cholesterol, onset in early 40s.**
Metabolic/Endocrine: **PGF: Diabetes, adult onset, diagnosed in his 40's, treated with insulin and diet, died at 83 due to renal failure.**
