Cancer: **PGF: prostate cancer onset at 70, treated with surgery, cause of death at 80**

Gastro-intestinal: **MGM: stomach infection cause of death at age 70**

Genital/Reproductive: **M: ovarian cysts resolved with hysterectomy at age 50**

Heart: **PGM: high blood pressure as a result of being overweight, did not take medication as prescribed which led to kidney failure as cause of death.**
