Allergies: **D: allergic to vancomycin and keflex antibiotics, resulting in rashes and vomiting**
Cancer: **MGM: leukemia, cause of death at age 51.**
Genital/Reproductive: **M: endometriosis, onset age 28, resolved with surgery.**
Heart: **F: high blood pressure and high cholesterol, onset early fifties, has reduced with lifestyle changes; MGF: heart attack, cause of death at age 72; PGM: high blood pressure, high cholesterol, heart attack in her seventies, still alive at age 83.**
Metabolic/Endocrine: **PGM: thyroid disease, hyperthyroid onset at age 35, manages with medication**
Muscles/Bones/Joints: **PGM: osteoporosis, onset late in life**
Neurological: **PGF: hydrocephalus (water on the brain), onset age 80; PGF: stroke, cause of death at age 82**
