FAMILY MEDICAL HISTORY

Allergies: **D: Hayfever, onset at 12, seasonal medication, managed. M: Hayfever, onset- teens, seasonal medication, managed. MGM: Hayfever, onset- teens, no treatment. PCo#1: Hayfever, since birth, seasonal medication, managed.**

Blood: **M: Anemia, onset at 59, related to Lymphoma's impact on blood cell counts.**

Gastro-intestinal: **F: Gastroesopagael Reflux Disease, onset at 55, diet/ lifestyle adjustment, managed.**

Genital/Reproductive: **PGF: Prostate Cancer, onset at 60, medication and diet, managed.**

Heart: **F: High Cholesterol, onset at 50, diet and exercise, condition managed. MGF: High Blood Pressure, onset in 40's, diet/ lifestyle changes, remains above average; MGF: Heart Attack, cause of death at 59. PGM: High Blood Pressure / High Cholesterol, onset at 55, temporary medication, diet/ lifestyle changes, conditions improved, still above average. PGF: Heart Disease, onset at 79, pacemaker, resulted in heart and kidney failure, cause of death at 80.**

Metabolic/Endocrine: **MGU#1: Diabetes, adult onset at 55, dialysis, condition managed.**

Neurological: **F: Migraines, teens and again in mid-40's, avoids food allergens (allergic to soy and wheat), managed. S: Benign Brain Tumor, onset at 15, shunt surgically placed in brain to deal with blockage from tumor (not removed), successful treatment; S: Migraines, onset in teens, OTC medication, managed (possibly related to shunt placed in brain). MGF: Stroke, onset at 55, diet/ lifestyle changes, condition managed.**
