This was a great indicator of his curiosity and interest in learning more about the work that we do here. To the interview, he wore black jeans and Timberland boots with an olive green and black checkered flannel shirt. He presents himself in a very clean cut and smooth manner. His wavy black hair was short and neatly gelled and combed. His ears are pierced and in them he wore stylish, diamond-shaped earrings. Donor 5378 has beautiful light brown eyes with thick curly eyelashes. He has a gorgeous smile, smooth ebony skin with a clear complexion, and his short, well-groomed beard did not obscure his cute dimples.

Donor 5378 grew up in the Bay Area, a household that he shared with his mother, his younger brother and older sister. Although he did not live with his paternal half-siblings, they continue to make an effort to call each other and see each other as often as possible. Much of his time with his dad was spent going on fishing trips, camping, and generally engaging in outdoorsy, nature-driven activities. His mother had a government job and worked closely with non-profits. She would bring donor 5378 along to help her with food drives, fundraisers, and community meals. Possessing a keen eye for real estate, his mom would also buy and flip homes. He warmly remembered helping his mom renovate some of her properties. From this experience, donor 5378 developed an interest in the real estate business too. He confided to us that he spends quite a bit of time watching house flipping TV shows on HGTV.

The above family medical history information has been self-reported by the donor. We work with each donor to obtain as complete and accurate information as possible, but we are unable to completely rule out the existence of other health information that is not known, or that remains unreported to us.

As a board certified genetic counselor, I have reviewed this donor's family medical history for identifiable patterns of inheritance that may place the donor or his biological offspring at increased risk for certain health problems. ("Increased risk" is risk that is greater than the risk in the general population).

Upon review of the available family medical history information from this donor, the risk for developing allergies or asthma may be slightly higher than the general population. Otherwise, the risk for similar health problems occurring in offspring is not expected to exceed the risk in the general population.
