Heart: **F: Heart Attack, at 53, takes aspirin daily, F: High Cholesterol, onset mid 30s, has taken meds, takes Aspirin daily**
Neurological: **M: Migraines, onset at 8 or 9, controls with meds; PGM: Stroke, onset in late 40s, had multiple strokes leading to death at age 65**
Respiratory: **F: mild Asthma, onset in childhood, prone to respiratory infections; B#2: Hayfever, onset in childhood, allergies now mild; MU#1: Lung Cancer, from smoking, cause of death at 65**
Muscle/Bone/Joint problem: **M: Cracked cartilage disk in spine, age of onset at 55, resolved with surgery and physical therapy**
