Allergies: **MGF: Hay fever, age of onset and treatment unknown, not serious**

Blood: **M: Anemia as child, self-resolved; MGF: Myeloma, diagnosed at 74, treated with mild chemotherapy, caused temporary anemia**

Gastro-intestinal: **M: Gallstones, diagnosed at 35, successfully removed with surgery; F: Appendicitis, onset at 13, treated with successful appendectomy; MGF: Ulcerative Colitis, onset in 50s, treated successfully with removal of part of stomach**

Genital/Reproductive: **B: Undescended testicle, successful operation at age 12**

Heart: **M: High Cholesterol, onset at 50, controlled with medication; MGF: Angina, onset in 70s, around emphysema diagnosis; PGF: High Blood Pressure, details unknown; PGF: Heart Attack, possible cause of death at 79 (Heart attack and Stroke occurred together)**

Mental Health: **D: Situational Depression. began treatment at age 18 for 9 mos., currently not taking meds and not experiencing depression; PU: Depression, controls with medication**

Metabolic/Endocrine: **M: Adult-Onset Diabetes age of onset, mid-40s. Treats condition by adjusting diet.**

Muscles/Bones/Joints: **F: Hernia diagnosed at 45, repaired with operation**

Neurological: **PGM: Stroke, cause of death at 87; PGF: Stroke, possible cause of death at 79 (Heart Attack and Stroke occurred together)**
