INTERVIEW NOTES: 4733

Sitting and talking with Donor 4733 is pleasant and easy. He presents himself well, dressed in a white and blue striped button down shirt under a gorgeous light grey, well-tailored suit with perfectly shined shoes. His rectangular frameless glasses and nicely coifed, inky black hair frame his face just right. 4733 has smooth caramel-colored skin, manicured nails and is movie star good-looking. His voice is distinctly kind and warm, his appearance is professional, and his manner is easy and self-assured.

As a child, donor 4733 remembers being full of energy and constantly *getting into things*. And although his high energy caused some difficulty in school, 4733 learned quickly to channel his energy into sports. Sports served as a perfect outlet for him, they provided a structured and healthy outlet for his abundance of energy. It was during this time that he learned about his resourcefulness and independence. For example, neither of his parents was able to shuttle him to and from his practices and games, so 4733 found ways to get there either by walking, riding his bike or catching rides with teammates. I think another young man in his position would not have been able to motivate all of this on his own. Above and beyond anything he was already doing, 4733 continued to seek out opportunities to become involved in something new. He told me excitedly about how he attended the high school wrestling team's practice, and basically walked onto the team, later competing in state-wide competitions. He wanted me to understand that wrestling didn't come naturally to him rather that the reason he was good at it is that he worked hard.

Donor 4733 has a very friendly demeanor; he is approachable and outgoing. He is also naturally drawn to leadership positions. The way he talks about his involvement in various activities reveals the pride he takes in his various leadership roles. He ran and won the seat as Vice President in grade school, attributing his win to the fact that he tossed the traditional podium speech method and delivered speech as a rap, a spoken word piece. He went on to graduate from high school with honors. He started coaching sports in middle school and really enjoyed leading teams of his peers. 4733 is self-motivated and driven to obtain his goals.

Listening to 4733 express his love and appreciation for his mother was a standout moment for me during our conversation. 4733 believes that he is a better person today because of her positive influence and the role that she held for him throughout his life. He is close with both of his parents, but asserts that he has a special bond with his mother, proudly calling himself a *Mama's boy*. He recounts how easily she shows her love, adding *my Mom fuels me everyday to be a better person*.

Donor 4733 had a religious upbringing, attending church regularly and attending private Catholic schools from kindergarten through college. Growing up, he felt that *religion didn't feel like a choice*, yet it laid a strong foundation for him. Over time religion transitioned from a being a perfunctory part of his childhood to being a chosen part of his daily adult life. 4733 believes that the most important things in life are *faith and family*.

My overall impression of donor 4733 is that he is an open, thoughtful, and motivated person who acts with sincerity and kindness. He presents himself professionally and respectfully, discussing his life experiences and challenges humbly. 4733 has an optimistic view of the future and a genuine thoughtfulness and reverence for his past.

This talent has given me the ability to be a great coach and mentor when it comes to sports and business.
