INTERVIEW NOTES: 5125

Donor 5125 is a large, strong young man with a gentle smile and a sweet, kind demeanor. He came to our interview wearing a grey button-up shirt with the sleeves rolled up and a pair of forest green suspenders that take the place of a belt. His hair is longer at the top, parted and combed to the side. He has a light mustache, the ends of which grow down past the corners of his mouth, a two-inch goatee, and sideburns that extend down to his jaw-- almost, but not quite, connecting to his goatee. Donor 5125 has tender, brown, almond-shaped eyes, and light eyebrows. His rounded face is very symmetrical, and he has high cheekbones.

Throughout most of his interview 5125 spoke fondly and at length about his family. It is easy to see that it is a huge part of his identity and something that brings him a great sense of pride. Donor 5125 was born in New Mexico. Shortly before he was born, his parents had relocated there after being offered amnesty to escape the civil war in El Salvador. Leaving their established lives, his parents had to start from scratch, working as dishwashers to support their family. Donor 5125 remembers that his parents worked very hard, juggling multiple jobs to provide for their family. His parents quickly moved up in the restaurant business, eventually owning and managing restaurants in New Mexico. An influential time in Donor 5125's life was when his father returned to college to complete his degree. He watched with pride as his father worked arduously to obtain this degree, even occasionally sleeping in the car when necessary. Donor 5125 said that his father was always trying to set the best example of himself for his children; behavior that Donor 5125 emulates with his own children today.

As a child, 5125's care was often the responsibility of his older sister, since their parents worked so many hours a day. His sister is still very protective of him. As a child, 5125 was very curious, tolerant, and tried hard to be compassionate and understanding. My brother and sister used to fight often, so I learned to be a mediator pretty young. As he grew up, he said that he was always a bit more open-minded than the rest of his family, speaking up about curiosities and challenging established norms.

Donor 5125's family moved frequently around California throughout his youth, but usually not far enough to necessitate changing schools. When he was 15 they decided to move back to New Mexico. Instead of starting again in a new high school, 5125 opted to *test out* and enter college directly. It was in community college that he gained a deeper interest for math and science, specifically chemistry. Combining his interest in science with his passion and family history around food, he decided to earn a degree as a pastry chef. He mentioned *how cooking and baking is a science, and chemistry is used extensively for the right outcome.* At community college he earned a pastry degree, and then moved to California to further his degree by attending a culinary academy. Donor 5125 loves the art of being a pastry chef. *I am an artist and a scientist,* always looking for new ways to create exciting dishes.

During his free time, Donor 5125 enjoys writing short stories, poems, and screen-plays with a friend. He also enjoys being a father and watching his two children grow. He is a family man, demonstrating the same devotion to his children that his mother and father showed him. Although no longer with his children's mother, he reports that they are still close. His current goal is to open up a dessert bar with which he can revive his love for innovatively crafted desserts. Donor 5125 is a giving, selfless, positive and optimistic soul who is a great addition to our program.
