INTERVIEW NOTES: 5615

Donor 5615 arrived to his interview looking sharp in a white button up patterned with tiny bicycles, a dark purple blazer and matching pants. He is olive-skinned and has hooded eyes, rosy cheeks and high cheek bones, a broad nose with a thin bridge, and a square jaw. His dark hair is short and loosely curled.

Donor 5615 grew up on the West Coast, and described his young self as *studious but rambunctious*. He enjoyed drawing, reading, playing outside and camping. His family frequently went on road trips and he fondly remembers visiting Yosemite and Yellowstone. He lived with his mother, a feng shui practitioner, his father, a labor lawyer, and his older brother. He described his parents as *revolutionary*, and he told us proudly that they had met through union organizing, and that they inspired him to *look out for those who aren't represented*.

In the 7th grade Donor 5615 moved to the East Coast. He told us he felt like the *weird city kid,* but he still enjoyed his time in school. He smiled as he told us about his excitement for the different science classes he took, such as biology and astronomy. Once Donor 5615 was a senior in high school he told us he *got it together,* and started working harder in school, deciding it was better to be *chill* than to get in trouble.

Donor 5615 moved back to the West Coast when he was 18, and there he got involved the *counterculture* scene. He enjoyed going to festivals, cooking for his friends, talking about art, and experimenting with psychedelics. He also began taking classes at the local junior college, including: dance, psychology, Chinese, and Spanish.

Unfortunately, Donor 5615 suffered a knee injury while working at a trampoline park. He underwent surgery and started using crutches. After visiting for a cousin's wedding, Donor 5615 decided to move to the Hawaiian Islands to heal. He lived on a friend's farm and experienced swimming with dolphins and connecting with nature. He took control of his health and felt *amazing*.

His life changed again, however, when he learned his girlfriend at the time was pregnant with twins. He felt unprepared, but knew it was important to be a good dad and support his kids. He made the incredibly difficult decision to leave the island and move back to the mainland, where he focused on increasing his skill set. He learned to code and created an app, but ultimately he wants a career where he can connect with others in a more personal and socially engaging way.

Today Donor 5615 enjoys making music, and he particularly enjoys *beatboxing* and *freestyling*. He also plays ukulele, guitar, bass, and can play the drums. He is inspired by *James Brown*, *Nina Simone*, and *old school soul*. He is active, practices jujitsu, and enjoys exploring parks and the outdoors with his kids. He takes pride in his ability to *adapt* and *rise to the occasion*, and he puts a great deal of value in *communication*. He dreams of being able to own land, farm, and connect with a community of like-minded people.

Overall, Donor 5615 is charismatic and intelligent, and it is clear that he has taken the time to grow and mature throughout his life. We are very lucky to have him in our program.
