He wore black framed glasses that complemented his face. He has full black hair that was nicely groomed longer on the top and short on the sides.

Donor 5673 was an only child but has a large amount of cousins on his father's side that are as close as siblings. His mother worked at the pre-school he attended and he ended up with a group of lifelong friends he's known since he was two. He was a very curious, active child who loved to explore his environment. His mother would take him for walks where he would insist they stop and smell every flower they encountered. He loved going to the park and climbing on all of the play structures. He also loved going to the zoo, an activity his mother indulged every weekend.

He lived in a quiet, small town in Northern California where he walked to school every day and attended school with the same group of friends he made in pre-school. He loved elementary school and excelled in school. He was especially gifted in math but struggled with reading, mainly because he never found any of the books interesting. Once he discovered the Magic Tree House series and the Chronicles of Narnia, he fell in love with reading. He continued to enjoy school both in middle school and high school. He performed in musicals during high school, including playing the lead in the school's production of Footloose. He loved to perform, particularly enjoying the dancing and acting. He played on the Lacrosse team and belonged to a drawing club. He discovered woodworking after taking woodshop and continues to do carpentry and wood-turning. He even took a turn playing the viola but quickly determined it wasn't for him.

Donor 5673 is adventurous, loving to try new restaurants and recipes as his father taught him how to cook. He also still loves to dance, and goes ballroom dancing monthly.
