INTERVIEW NOTES: 5714

Donor 5714 came to the interview wearing a burgundy shirt with gold trim and a gold lightning emblem on the top left side with dark pants. He has a round face, soft deep set denim-colored blue eyes that bring out his rosy cheeks and a lovely smile highlighted by attractive crow's-feet. He has a prominent nose and ears with full dark eyebrows. His dark brown hair is worn in a buzz cut and he has a short beard. Our staff thinks he looks like Steve Carell with a fuller face.

Donor 5714 grew up with his parents, older brother, younger sister and a cousin he was really close with and considered another sister. He describes his mother as a petite woman who is a *talker* and *loves to gossip*. He recalls being *attached to her at the hip* growing up and was always spoiled by her. In contrast, donor 5714 describes his father as stern and rules oriented, who made you work for toys and spending money. His father was a professional athlete on a national team who ended his career after suffering frequent major injuries. Donor 5714 and his siblings were all very active growing up and spent time playing soccer, basketball and playing in their apartment building's pool. While in the house they often played board games, video games or watched movies and cartoons.

In school Donor 5714's favorite subject was math. He also liked social studies, but didn't really like history which he now regrets as he can see the importance of knowing one's history. He now reads a lot of history books in his free time. Donor 5714's father wanted all of his children to participate in school activities to avoid staying cooped up in the house. As he was not a fan of team sports, he asked his father for a gym membership. He immediately fell in love with weightlifting and increasing his strength idolizing Sylvester Stallone and Arnold Schwarzenegger.

As Donor 5714 got older, he became fascinated by professional wrestling stars like Hulk Hogan and the other over the top personalities. Even though he knew professional wrestling wasn't *real*, he still wanted to know how they performed the stunts and moves that seemed so real. Donor 5714 persuaded his mom to buy him a book about the secrets of wrestling and became hooked. Donor 5714 eventually began wrestling at a school for people who wanted to become professionals. Even though the gym's owner didn't think he was serious he stuck to it and ended up pro-wrestling for 14 years. He recalls learning more life lessons (good and bad) from wrestling. It taught Donor 5714 to grow a *thick skin* but also the dangers of hazing and bullying. Donor 5714 traveled extensively performing as an *extra* including to Mexico, Canada, Oregon, Florida and all over California. He even met his girlfriend at one of his wrestling matches!

Donor 5714 was the first person in his family to go to college and was determined to finish. Donor 5714 received his bachelor's in education as he wanted to be a teacher which remains an ultimate goal of his. When asked about a challenge he overcame in his life he mentions his first job in the circuit industry where he worked for almost 15 years while wrestling. Even though he was successful, he was not fulfilled and tried his hand at personal training which he loved. Donor 5714 was then promoted several times until he became a regional manager, losing his control over a single facility. He did not like the loss of control and shifted to recruiting and eventually managing employees at two locations. He likes his new job and learned to always *bet on himself* and never give up! He is also a certified life coach and likes to do life coaching for fun.

Donor 5714 enjoys being adventurous and traveling with his girlfriend. He also enjoys activities such as zip lining and indoor racing. Donor 5714 loves to watch superhero movies and reading comic books which he began as a child. Donor 5714 says if he had \$500 and a free day he would pamper himself by getting a massage, facial, pedicure and having surf and turf at a good restaurant. Donor 5714 is very motivated and ambitious. We are happy to have him in our program!

The above family medical history information has been self-reported by the donor. We work with each donor to obtain as complete and accurate information as possible, but we are unable to completely rule out the existence of other health information that is not known, or that remains unreported to us.

Heart disease: Multiple members of DIS 5714's family are reported to have died of heart failure or heart attacks. Anecdotally, individuals often have the understanding their family members died of heart conditions, when in reality there may be a different underlying cause. In other words, the heart failure is often either 1) the cause of death, but it was secondary to a different underlying medical condition or 2) the way information is disseminated through the family as it is easy to understand and communicate to others. Regardless, heart disease is common and it is certainly in the realm of possibility that all four grandparents did die of this condition. As reported, there is a strong family history of heart disease, but all affected individuals are over the age of 50 and are not genetically related to each other, aside from the paternal uncle. As reported, there may be an increased risk for heart disease in offspring of DIS 5714 due to the presence of genetic variants that confer a predisposition for heart disease. <u>That said, given the common nature of heart disease, this risk is likely to be not much higher than that of the general population and would likely depend on other factors such as diet and environmental exposures.</u>

As a board certified genetic counselor, I have reviewed this donor's family medical history for identifiable patterns of inheritance that may place the donor or his biological offspring at increased risk for certain health problems. ("Increased risk" is risk that is greater than the risk in the general population). As reported to me, there does not appear to be personal medical health history that would confer an increased risk beyond the general population risk.
