INTERVIEW NOTES: 5966

Donor 5966 arrived at our interview wearing a bright blue hoodie, a navy wool vest, khakis, brown Nike sneakers, and a red crossbody bag. He is tall, standing a whopping 6' 5" with a lanky figure with straight brown hair cut short with a widow's peak. He has a square-shaped face with symmetrical features including slightly hooded eyes and thick eyebrows that compliment his round light blue eyes. He has thin lips and a nice square jawline. He was extremely easy to talk to, cracking jokes frequently and taking the time to explain things that may get lost in translation or through cultural differences.

Donor 5966 grew up in a densely populated city in Siberia which he referred to as a "young city" full of students. When asked what his hometown was like, he laughed and said, "a cold place." An only child, donor 5966 describes his father as physically affectionate and very smart and his mother as open-minded and determined. She worked hard to send him to a better school and focused on teaching him independence and responsibility. He started taking the train to school by himself when he was 7 years old. He told us a story of a time he skipped school to hang out with a stray dog he spotted from the train. His mother saw him with the dog from the window of her train to work and asked how the dog was when she came home that night!

He says that he was very extroverted as a child and would help his grandmother sell perogies on the beach with his charm and talkative nature. He was an active kid, participating in various extracurricular activities like theater, martial arts, and boxing. His mother was an avid reader, and his childhood home was full of books. He wasn't very interested in reading when he was younger, but a lifelong interest in history and biology was kick started when his mom brought home a few encyclopedias. He would spend hours reading them and looking at pictures of animals and dinosaurs. Nowadays, he's always looking up random facts on Wikipedia in his spare time. He also enjoys classic literature, preferring to read in his native Russian.

He explains that while he inherited his decision making from his mom, his softness and love of living creatures came from his dad. Donor 5966's dad was a long-distance trucker and sometimes he would accompany his dad on his trips during school breaks. One time they transported a trailer full of guinea pigs to the airport and he got to cuddle them on the way. Another time his dad saw a puppy on the side of the road and kept it by the foot heater in the cab of the truck to warm it up. Later, that dog became his travel companion.

Donor 5966 has been playing the acoustic guitar since the age of 12, saying that learning the guitar was a big trend among his peers. He used to play music with his college buddies and now occasionally plays for his friends. Donor 5966 moved out to the US about 15 years ago, looking for a better quality of life. He studied British English in college but stated that it was more academic than conversational and being immersed in an English-speaking country was a learning experience. He expressed that he has learned to be less impulsive as he's gotten older, and if making the decision now he may have waited a few more years before moving to another country but is very happy how things turned out in the end. One of the biggest cultural differences he is learning is to be more in touch with his emotions. When asked how he would like to be described, donor 5966 said that he likes to think of himself as interesting, easy-going, caring, and funny.

One of donor 5966's favorite activities is to go on hikes with his wife and dog – though he states that his dog is really the one taking them on hikes! He and his wife are saving up to start a family of their own, and he is currently starting IT school while his wife focuses on her career in dentistry.

I would like to have my own small and then big distribution company or other business that is more essential for people than entertaining or food type of business. Medical supplier and distributor for example.

How would you describe your skills and interests in the following areas?

Math: Good. I had really good grades at school and specially in community college then I lost the interest. **Mechanical:** Decent. I cannot fix an engine or transmission as well electrical problems of my car but basic things like changing radiator, brakes, alternator, shocks, thermostat, serpentine belts, battery, oil, filter and etc I do myself.

Athletic: Good. My favorite activity is hiking. I also go to a gym two-three times per week. Naturally I have a good genetics and my BMI is always good regardless of my diet or activities. So I don't really work hard to keep myself in a good shape thus I prefer be in a forest or mountains than in a building lifting weights. Also I am really good swimmer not professional but growing up next to a lake I spent swimming all summers long till age 18.
